

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to provide some reflections on the 2018/19 season.

Firstly, to the Board. As volunteers in a game that is demanding more and more from a governance perspective, my sincere thanks for your work and support over the many challenges we have faced. Having recently reset our Strategic Priorities, I feel extremely confident that we are well placed to lead the game in our region.

There are many challenges confronting the game, but I couldn't help but smile, looking on as Canterbury's Gary Stead, Craig McMillan, Matt Henry, Tom Latham and Henry Nichols took part in one of the greatest pieces of sporting theatre I have ever witnessed. It was wonderful to once again be reminded of the incredible sport that is cricket. It was also a brilliant example of how sport and the way it is played and the way a team behave, can have an impact far greater than the game itself.

I certainly feel privileged to play a small part in this special game.

Canterbury, alongside the other major associations in New Zealand, faces significant challenges to stay relevant, both on and off the field. It was clear in our Strategic Review that ensuring clarity in our purpose and priorities has never been more important.

Balancing community and participation, alongside a high performance environment to develop future Black Caps and White Ferns has never been harder.

A difficult year financially, but pleasing to report a result in line with last year's result, when at one stage it was looking a lot worse. After a write off of assets to the value of \$33,193 (last year nil) we have posted a deficit for the year of \$57,372. This compared to a deficit the previous year of \$59,328. From a cashflow perspective an \$80k reduction in liabilities on the previous year means that after allowing for the purchase of new assets (\$23,607) and Loan and Finance lease payments (\$22,151) we have a reduction in our cash balance at year end of \$60,864.

Jeremy and the team worked tirelessly to ensure we managed the business of cricket in a fiscally prudent way. As was publicly stated, funding for the game is certainly challenging across New Zealand, but we are very pleased with the progress we are making with our members in driving efficiency, with NZ Cricket in ensuring funding certainty, and within our own team in having clarity in how we can reduce fixed costs in future years, and most importantly, in showing innovation and leadership in growing revenue.

Canterbury has a proud playing history, and the 2018/19 season for the Canterbury Men's will be seen as the building blocks and development of the next generation. A challenging season results wise, but one that will provide great learning for the coaches and playing group.

CANTERBURY CRICKET

The Canterbury Women's 2018/19 season was highlighted by a fantastic run by the Magicians to reach the final of the Burger King Super Smash. In a fantastic final they were narrowly beaten by the favourites, Wellington. In a landmark year for Women's Cricket in New Zealand, I am extremely excited about our ongoing opportunities to grow participation in performance of the women's game.

I have mentioned the Strategic Review that the CCA Board and Management has completed. As a new Chair and relatively new Board, we have walked into the challenges of this year with an open mind and optimism. The most important priority for the Board as we look forward, and one that we acknowledge must improve, is in our relationships and communication with our members.

As guardians of the Game, we must provide leadership, strategic direction, and help facilitate the growth and evolution of the game. The only way we can continue to do this is to invest more time with our members and earn the trust to help grow the game together.

My sincere thanks to Jeremy and his management team for their outstanding work throughout the year. This is a demanding business and teams commitment is above and beyond expectation.

Also special thanks to Anup Nathu who stepped up to the plate as President, and provided calm and measured counsel to myself and the Board.

We have had some incredible performances on the field as teams and as individuals. Our age group teams taking their first steps as Canterbury players, First Class and List A debuts made, Men's and Women's Super Smash double headers, Canterbury Cricket records broken, domestic records broken and deserved international recognition. The individual performances and results can be found further in the Annual Report, but I would like to add a personal thanks to the two Captains Cole McConchie and Frances Mackay who led both teams admirably. The Magicians had a fantastic run all the way to the Final of the Burger King Super Smash only to be beaten by the finest of margins against the heavily favoured Wellington Blaze while the Men's Plunket Shield fought back brilliantly in the second half of the season to finish second in the four day competition.

Hagley hosted some brilliant BLACKCAPS performances this year, firstly with Sri Lanka here for the return of the Boxing Day Test and then Bangladesh for an ODI in February. Thank you to our friends at the Canterbury Cricket Trust, Christchurch City Council and of course the tireless ground staff who provide us with the best facilities in the country.

Off the field it continues to be a hard market to prosper in, however we have had some great successes with new digital platforms launched, new commercial initiatives (Business Club, Coaching Camps and partnerships), improved attendances at the Burger King Super Smash and increased involvement in the local community. I'd like to thank all our partners and sponsors, old and new, and we look forward to working with you in the future and continuing the exciting journey we have ahead of us.



At the grassroots level we have tried to continue to support the growth of the game as best we can, working with the Districts to help cricket in Canterbury continue to grow, despite some difficult circumstances. Finally, I would like to personally thank the Board for their continued support and all the staff who dedicate so much more than the usual 9 to 5 to their roles.

OPERATIONS REPORT

The 2018/19 cricket season will forever be remembered because of the events of 15 March, 2019. The impact of this terrorist event will undoubtedly have implications across cricket delivery not only in Christchurch but across the country and at all levels of the game. In many respects it was worse than the effects of the earthquakes because of the deliberateness surrounding it. And it removed yet another opportunity from Christchurch to host an international event, a Test Match between the BLACKCAPS and the Bangladesh team who are fast becoming a force to contend with on the international stage.

Our results at domestic cricket and national underage level were disappointing with the best efforts being the men's and women's teams finishing 2nd in the Plunket Shield and Burger King Super Smash competitions respectively.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

The 2018/19 international programme provided Canterbury the chance to host two men's Test matches against Sri Lanka in December, Bangladesh in March and one One Day International against Bangladesh in February at Hagley Oval. These events require a collaborative approach to ensure the best player and spectator experience and Canterbury Cricket would like to acknowledge the support and staff from the Canterbury Cricket Trust, Christchurch City Council, Christchurch NZ, New Zealand Cricket and Vbase who collectively ensured we achieved these goals.

The Boxing Day Test was won convincingly by New Zealand. Sri Lanka won the toss and elected to field and when New Zealand were out within 50 overs for 178, an early finish was potentially on the cards. Sri Lanka replied with 104 in 41 overs with Boult claiming 6-30 and Southee picking up the top 3 batsmen cheaply. New Zealand posted an impressive 585/4 in their second innings with big century contributions from the Canterbury duo of Latham and Nicholls. Sri Lanka also fared slightly better in their second turn at bat, being dismissed for 236 with key contributions from Chandimal and Mendis. Boult snared another 3 wickets with Wagner picking up 4.

Short Scoreboard: New Zealand 178 (Watling 46, Southee 68) and 585/4 (Raval 74, Latham 176, Williamson 48, Taylor 40, Nicholls 162 no., de Grandhomme 71 no.) beat Sri Lanka 104 (Mathews 33 no., Boult 6-30, Southee 3-35) and 236 (Chandimal 56, Mendis 67, Boult 3-77, Wagner 4-48) by 423 runs.

On February 16, New Zealand took on Bangladesh in the second of three One Day Internationals to be played around the country. New Zealand won the toss and sent the Bangladesh team in to bat. The pace of Lockie Ferguson saw him capture 3 wickets as Bangladesh were dismissed just inside their 50 overs despite solid contributions from Mityhum Ali and Sabbir Rahman. In reply, Guptill monstered the Bangladesh bowling attack, carving 115 from 88 balls in a strong display of



power hitting and he thoroughly deserved the Man of the Match Award.

Short Scoreboard: Bangladesh 226 (Mithun Ali 57, Sabbir Rahman 43, Ferguson 3-43) lost to New Zealand 229/2 (Guptill 118, Williamson 65 no.) by 8 wickets.

The third and final Test between New Zealand and Bangladesh, scheduled for 16 -20 March, was cancelled after the attack on two mosques in Christchurch on the afternoon of Friday 15 March.

In addition, Hagley Oval hosted a Twenty20 cricket match marketed as the 'Black Clash' for the Lomu-Crowe Trophy on 25 January 2019. Team Rugby took on Team Cricket with a number of former and current internationals from both codes offering a great spectacle for the 8000+ crowd and with the rugby players demonstrating skill levels many club cricket players would aspire to. Team Rugby won the toss and elected to field and, despite some sharp bowling and excellent catching, Team Cricket reached a competitive 168. Team Rugby, who had obtained the services of Brendon McCullum through a last-minute team transfer, reached 171/5 early in the 19th over with McCullum, Kaylum Boshier (a former NZ Under 19 cricket representative) and Jordie Barrett scoring the bulk of the runs.

Short Scoreboard: Team Cricket 168/8 (Grant Elliot 43) lost to Team Rugby 171/5 (B McCullum 48, K Boshier 30, J Barrett 38 no.) by 5 wickets.

CANTERBURY CLUB CHAMPION

The 2018/19 Canterbury club champion round robin tournament again saw the three top club teams from around Canterbury compete for the title of Canterbury club champion. The Canterbury club champion matches were contested by St Albans Cricket Club (representing Christchurch Metro), Temuka Cricket Club (representing South Canterbury) and Cheviot Cricket Club (representing Canterbury Country). St Albans proved eventual winners and competed at the National Club Championship Tournament hosted by the Cornwall Cricket Club in Auckland in April 2018. St Albans were unbeaten in the round robin phase with all-round team performances in each match being the key to their success. They met Napier Tech Old Boys in the Grand Final and, despite having beaten them earlier in the competition, when asked to bat first, had a bad day at the office with none of their batsmen scoring more than 20 runs. Defending 96 was always going to be a tough ask and Napier Tech eventually claimed a 5-wicket victory.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

In addition to hosting international cricket, Hagley Oval hosted the majority of our domestic men's and women's 'home' fixtures. Christchurch club and junior cricket matches also enjoyed some playing time on the Oval. With only 11 strips on the wicket block, this is only achievable through the superb efforts of the Hagley Oval groundstaff, ably led by Ashley Head. These guys epitomise teamwork and the pride in their work and their efforts to ensure, that even in the case of poor weather, minimal playing time is lost is testament to that teamwork and their understanding of cricket pitch preparation. When you consider they are also responsible for the training blocks, the Nursery Ground and three pitches on Hagley Corner you can appreciate the enormity of the task. It is no secret that both international and domestic match referees are impressed by the efforts of this group and appreciate the expertise, understanding and communication they can provide.

We also acknowledge the efforts of the staff at Mainpower Oval, Rangiora. Mainpower Oval hosted two Plunket Shield matches in 2018/19 along with numerous other practice and pre-season fixtures. With our desire to continue to host a mix of international and domestic cricket at Hagley, Canterbury Cricket acknowledge we don't currently have the required number of pitches to host a full season of fixtures at Hagley Oval. With the ongoing development of Mainpower Oval and the understanding and support of Peter Devlin, Chief Executive of Canterbury Country Cricket, Mainpower provides our elite cricketers with a quality second-tier venue for their matches.

On 27 December, Day 2 of the Test Match at Hagley Oval, a coaching 'activation' was run on the Nursery Ground behind the main oval. This event was superbly planned and organised by Dan Vann from Evolution Sports and Glenn Hooper. A number of cricket stations were provided for children to test out and challenge their cricket skills. Canterbury Cricket provided their inflatable cricket equipment which proved very popular with children of all ages and the valuable feedback from both children and parents alike offered insight into how we can enhance the cricket experience at internationals for these groups at future events. Volunteers, shoulder tapped by Dan and Glenn, including Canterbury Cricket staff, manned each station and groups were rotated through stations to ensure a diversity of experience. My sincere thanks go to Dan, Glenn and all the volunteers who brought this activation to life for the 100-plus participants.

I would like to acknowledge the efforts of the ground staff of the various training and match venues, the staff of both Canterbury Cricket and the Canterbury Districts and Sub-Associations and all the volunteers who give their time selflessly and play such critical, and often thankless, roles in supporting players, schools and clubs throughout the region. Canterbury has one of the largest geographical regions and this creates challenges for the delivery of cricket however the contributions by the above groups ensure the ongoing development and delivery of cricket throughout the region.

And finally, a big thank you to Eugene Sanders for his match management support throughout the season. Eugene has had a key role to play in organisation of matches at elite and underage levels, including match management of domestic and international fixtures.

With an increasing emphasis on the need for diversity in sports administration and participation in all sport, not just cricket, there is no better time to start addressing the change required to achieve this diversity. Sport NZ have already indicated that funding to national sports organisations will be linked to evidence of diversity within those organisations. This will directly impact New Zealand Cricket and in turn, the Major Associations. Canterbury Cricket and its District and sub-Associations need to address this requirement sooner rather than later to ensure the ongoing growth and survival of cricket. While there is no doubt that what we have done for the last 100 years has worked, society has changed considerably since then and now is the time to ensure the growth and survival of cricket for the next 100 years. If we have learned nothing from the events of March 15, 2019, let us at least acknowledge that we are a diverse country and embracing that diversity will ensure the advancement and survival of our sport. Canterbury Cricket's aim remains to make cricket the summer game of choice for anyone who wants to participate and adapting to the diverse needs of our community will assist in achieving this.

In conclusion, I would like to record my sincere appreciation to all those supporters of Canterbury Cricket, including Sport Canterbury, New Zealand Cricket and the various trusts and sponsors. Your support has been invaluable and has enabled us to focus on improving participant numbers and create memorable experiences for players and fans alike.

MARKETING REPORT

Fresh faces, lessons learnt and exciting times ahead. Those were the key themes that I can draw on from the past season. I couldn't have asked for a better introduction to Canterbury Cricket, than by starting in December right at the thick of the season. I was welcomed by Nick Harbidge (Marketing Intern), Jordan Cameron (Events Intern) and Janelle Tyler from Buutveld Carter (Events Manager). All of us were new to the team, and all equally new to working in sport meant there were some challenges ahead but also some fun to be had.

SUPER SMASH

Last season an emphasis was put on not only growing men's T20 domestic cricket, but more importantly the women's game. Although our teams adopted different colours, the overall design element of the playing kit was aligned for the first time in an attempt to bring the teams together. Double headers were introduced to help build the profile of the women's game and boy did they deliver!

Sky TV covered more games including seven women's fixtures, and believe it or not, one of the Canterbury Magicians games toppled records with a mammoth viewership of 43,800. To put that into perspective, 44,000 people watched the men's final – only 200 more!

The national event delivery blueprint was implemented for a better fan experience across the country and we hope to improve this even further next summer.

The total attendance for the competition was the highest it's been in 5 years, while total viewers (TV) were up an impressive 43%.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

Thanks to our lovely new cricket inflatables (funded by the New Zealand Racing Board and Youthtown), last summer saw us out and about in the community more than ever.

Our inflatables went from Buller to Timaru and proved to be a success for more than 2000 children who fancied a go. We attended pool parties, club days, junior prize givings, Hagley Oval matches and one-off events such as our Kings launch day, I Love New Brighton and Children's Day.

A special thank you goes out to all the Canterbury Cricket staff and players who gave their time and energy, as well as Hellers for providing the hundreds of free sausages we used to feed hungry children across Canterbury.

The inflatables provide a great opportunity for children to engage with our sport, our brand and our players to inspire future cricketers of Canterbury. Plans are already in place for the 2019/20 summer ahead as we look to roll these out wider.

Our Canterbury Kings squad also attended Camp Quality out in Living Springs again this year. Camp Quality brings fun, hope and happiness into the lives of children living with cancer, inspiring them to get on with being kids again. It's extremely rewarding for the team to give back to the kids and seeing the looks on their faces is a memory we're sure our playing group won't forget anytime soon. Until next year!

We're always looking at more ways we can give back to the community, so if you know of any amazing ideas please reach out to us.

WEBSITE

Around the middle of 2018, Canterbury Cricket reached out to Hairy Lemon as a potential partner to develop a digital platform for all things cricket across the Canterbury region. We wanted to build a website that could better promote cricket, be a first port of call for ticketing, get more engagement from users and really just be a cohesive hub for all things cricket. We consolidated the CCA websites into one, increasing the effectiveness of our digital presence by having just one space for users to go to. The website went live last November and has seen a 20% increase in traffic and users since launch. We will continue to optimise the site and make improvements where required over the coming years.

DATABASE / EMAIL MARKETING

Early in 2018, New Zealand Cricket headed up "Project Harmony". The reasoning for the project was to merge all fan data in New Zealand for the purposes of cost efficiencies, sharing best practice and providing a more consistent customer experience. Ubiquity was chosen as the preferred platform, with user friendliness, on-going training, support and a parent/child setup being the key factors for success. We are now communicating with our fan base regularly, while our database continues to grow. If you haven't subscribed to our email database, you better head to our website and do so now!

SOCIAL MEDIA

Social media continues to be the leading marketing channel among fan-based communications. At the beginning of the season a decision was made to merge the Canterbury Cricket and Canterbury Kings to align to our digital strategy of creating a central hub for all things cricket. Growth of around 10% was achieved across Facebook and Twitter while Instagram saw a huge uptake in fans growing over 100% although we're still only scratching the surface of our potential. Keep your eyes on this space. Across Facebook, Twitter and Instagram we have 28,000 followers.



I'd also like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to all of those who gave their time and energy over the summer. From throwing tennis balls with the inflatables to cooking sausages on the BBQ and managing the Super Smash event delivery, you've all been amazing, and we couldn't have done it without you by our side.

COMMUNITY CRICKET REPORT

The 2018/19 season was the first year New Zealand Cricket (NZC) introduced Key Performance Indicators (KPI's) for both the major and district/sub associations in community cricket. This funding attached to these KPI's was appropriately labelled the Cricket Network Partnership Investment (CNPI). The KPI's ranged from coach development initiatives, diversity in decision-making roles, live scoring and increased responsibility around compliance and accountability. It is fitting to start this section of our annual report with this as all our member associations worked incredibly hard with local volunteers, clubs and schools to achieve these targets. A massive congratulations and thanks must go to district/ sub association staff and the Canterbury Cricket shared service team for their effort in this space over the past season. In addition to achieving the targets set by the KPI's there are other notable highlights from around our region.

- Canterbury Country, South Canterbury and the Christchurch partnership had some of the highest percentage of qualified coaches in the country, particularly given the number of junior (school and club) and youth (club) team numbers. This project was well supported by club volunteers and delivered around the region by Toby Doyle, Shane Gilkinson and Keryn Ambler.
- Buller Cricket continue to innovate to recruit and maintain playing numbers. Not only has the senior competition moved to a Thursday night resulting in increased numbers, but Jordan Hill has worked hard with local primary schools to recruit and develop two primary school girl's teams who may attend the South Island girl's competition in Christchurch in January.
- Mid Canterbury have diversified their revenue streams.
 With major contributions from local volunteers, transporters and farmers they have a growing social enterprise that will continue to support local cricket.
- South Canterbury unfortunately lost six weeks of junior cricket due to weather at the start of the season, however with some excellent planning and innovative thinking a major festival day was run at Aorangi Park to compensate for this. The Canterbury Cricket inflatable equipment was also used, and 50 young participants experienced playing, diving, hitting and catching skills and drills on the day.
- West Coast Cricket have now reached a stage where their cricket development role needs to be advanced to the next stage. This will involve exploring the option of a more permanent position, with increased contact time to enable connection and engagement with their growing participation numbers.



- Canterbury Country undertook a major renovation of Mainpower Oval with a new block and outfield. This was achieved with significant investment and support from the Waimakariri District Council.
- Mike Fisher from Christchurch Metro Cricket led an initiative with the Christchurch City Council to increase maintenance, supply, watering and grass cover to many Christchurch pitches. As a result the quality of these local facilities has increased considerably.

COACH DEVELOPMENT AND MENTORING

As part of a nationwide coach accreditation process Cricket Associations in Canterbury undertook significant work in this area to register and qualify coaches across the community pathway. In total 481 coaches were qualified, ranging from junior soft ball levels through to youth club hard ball competitions. In addition to attending practical courses, coaches were required to complete online modules covering such elements as coaching process, long term athlete development, age & stage guidelines, understanding of growth and maturation, all the while with a specific focus on how to effectively deliver coaching sessions. The focus moving forward is to provide quality ongoing support. This will include a mixture of in-field coach observations, club coach support, skill-based workshops and mentoring opportunities. Canterbury Cricket is committed to providing quality support for our coaches which will result in a better experience for our players and contribute to our overarching goal of developing lifelong cricketers. Our thanks go to New Zealand Cricket for their efforts in producing support and resources but a special mention must go to the hard-working game development staff across the region who worked tirelessly to achieve and surpass targets in this area.

OFFICIATING

In the 2018/19 season 438 people attended umpire and scorer training sessions. These courses ranged from the Introduction to Umpiring course, new scorers training and understanding updated playing conditions. These sessions were delivered in secondary schools, at club trainings and though the various winter and summer training programmes that our members offer. The major highlight this season is the number of youth that are interested in

this space. For some of these youth it is about increasing their knowledge of the game, for others they see an opportunity to develop and enter the umpire pathway. Further to this a total of 109 junior and youth umpires were utilised over the season in various tournaments. On average these umpires officiated for a minimum of 3 days. This is an exciting development and one that will provide long term success and sustainability in the umpiring, scoring and match officiating space. During the recent off-season Canterbury Cricket were contracted and partnered NZC to create online training modules and update the National Level 1 and Level 2 umpiring courses. Officiating is now receiving more attention and acknowledgement by both Canterbury Cricket and more recently with NZC through the development of a specific KPI related directly to officiating. The Canterbury Regional Cricket Umpires Association, led by Jim Henderson, continue to provide support and work with Canterbury Cricket. There are exciting developments in the pipeline and we thank Jim and his committee for their continued effort and support.

FEMALE ENGAGEMENT

Female engagement remains a key priority area for both Canterbury Cricket and New Zealand Cricket. Programmes have been piloted and attempts have been made to connect women and girls into playing, coaching, governing, officiating and volunteering. This remains a work in progress and one that we are confident will continue to be developed. Aside from the excellent work to include more women in decision-making roles, there are two other initiatives worth mentioning. The NZC led Yeah! Girls programme was a huge success for Canterbury. This programme was delivered with hard work and support from key cricket clubs, namely Burnside West Christchurch University, Sydenham, Leeston, Southbridge and Rangiora Cricket Clubs. The Yeah! Girls programme was ably led by Danielle You. Danielle was an excellent operator and an absolute pleasure to have part of the team. She engaged well with the young women and girls, the club volunteers and the cricket family to ensure this programme achieved the best possible outcome. A total of 212 females engaged in Yeah! Girls over the length of the 10-week programme. This number does not include the additional school, holiday programme, youth programme, after school promotion and activation visits. The aim of the programme was to get non-engaged young women involved in cricket. The programme did not look or feel like our traditional cricket products, and while this attracted criticism by some, the modified, fun, social nature of the programme was well appreciated and accepted by the participants with 85% of participants wanting to come back if the programme was run again. Overall there was a 57% retention rate in the programme, with 58% of respondents said the activities were the main reason for coming and 78% of

them indicating they would recommend the programme to their friends. This data has been invaluable and provides us with practical learnings which we can use to improve what was delivered. Canterbury Cricket look forward to working with clubs again in the 2019/20 season to deliver an even more successful programme in this space.

The other major highlight of the season was the creation of the Forward Foundation Shield, a soft ball tournament that will run along side the more traditional Secondary School Girls Cup. This initiative fills a large gap in the pathway to retain young women in the game that are not yet ready or prepared to play in a hard ball, traditional competition. Unfortunately, the actual tournament was rained off and will now be run in November 2019 where six teams will compete.

KEY PROJECTS:

One Cricket Stage 2 began in November 2018 and is still in progress. This stage was about analyzing the current structure and exploring where additional improvements and adjustments could be made to maximize efficiency, effectiveness and support to the volunteer organisations and people that deliver the game. The cricket delivery structure needs to reflect the needs of people and society today, and with ongoing changes and pressures on people's time, cricket must continue to assess and evolve. Stage 2 proposed a more centrally-led model, with specifically trained staff or contractors around the region delivering and supporting grass roots participation and delivery through clubs and schools. The main reason for this was to reduce the responsibilities placed on our volunteer decision-makers and to increase specifically skilled roles at the grass roots separated into coach development, club and hub support and participation. Extensive research has been completed and supported by NTM Consultants and special thanks must go to Nicki Turner and Tracey Macleod for their dedication, robustness and consultative approach. This research also included a visit to Melbourne to meet with Cricket Australia, Cricket New South Wales, Cricket Victoria and a handful of local club members. A special thanks must go to those associations for their willingness to host us and share best practice models and research. The steering group members involved in this stage have contributed heavily to the proposed structure. This has taken longer than anticipated but will be worth it if we can get to an agreed result. A special thank you to our three cricket managers Peter Devlin, Mark Medlicott and Mike Harvey and to our independent members, Kristy Havill, Camila Obel, Mike Satterthwaite and Bruce Morton, our Sport Canterbury representative. If a commitment to the future needs of our participants, coaches, officials and volunteers can be agreed along with an acknowledgement that clubs and schools still require more support to manage compliance, accountability and decision making

pressure, I am confident a structure can be agreed on and implemented that will sustain and grow our game long term.

One of the other key projects for 2018/19 was the Places and Spaces plan for Christchurch and Canterbury Country. This project was funded by the Christchurch City Council and Sport Canterbury and led by Kevin Collier through Recreation Sport and Leisure Consultancy. This is a document that will guide decision-making both internally in the cricket family and externally through local councils and trust funders. Thank you for those involved in this process with special acknowledgement to Kevin Collier for his professionalism and guidance through this project.

Early in the 2018/19 season the decision was made to explore new ideas or tools to promote and activate junior and youth participation. With investment from Youthtown and New Zealand Racing Board (NZRB), Canterbury Cricket purchased an inflatable catching mat and an inflatable net. This equipment activated children and youth in Buller primary schools, Timaru and Ashburton festival days, Canterbury Kings game days, at the Black Clash match, the BLACKCAPS test match against Sri Lanka, a number of Christchurch City Council events and several club open days and prizegivings throughout the season. Our sincere thanks to Youthtown and NZRB for their investment. This equipment provided fun, laughter and competition to over 4000 participants in a total of 25 events. We are absolutely confident that the 2019/20 season will see an increase in those numbers.

COLLABORATION AND PARTNERSHIPS:

Under the Cluster model implemented in September 2017 our members associations and Canterbury Cricket have continued to develop the working relationships with each other. This 'One Team' approach has provided insight, awareness and shared knowledge across the sport sector and within our family to make more effective, participant-focused decisions. This approach needs to continue and continue to advance if we are to ensure our structure and offerings are tailored to the participants, coaches, clubs and volunteers that are involved. Thank you to those district/ sub association staff who continue to push and support this approach.

In addition to internal partnerships, Canterbury Cricket have been working on external collaborative ideas, particularly with the team at Sport Canterbury through Jon Derry and Bruce Morton. This shared passion for sport and wanting to maximise our impact at a grass roots level is appreciated and supported. Relationships with Mainland Football, Canterbury Rugby, Canterbury Touch and Canterbury Netball are in their early stages, with conversations already underway. The coming year is likely to see these relationships trial new initiatives and create long-term partnerships that not only aid cricket but sport in the Canterbury region.

Canterbury Cricket would not be able to lead or work with our member associations, clubs and schools without the support of our local trust and gaming funders. This investment directly resources the shared service team, amateur cricket and provides support for the purchase of equipment required to play our game. A special thank you to the organisations and people from Rata Foundation, New Zealand Community Trust, The Southern Trust, The Lion Foundation, Trust Aoraki, One Foundation, Air Rescue, Pub Charity, Youthtown, New Zealand Racing Board and CERT (Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Trust) . A special acknowledgement must go to Sport Canterbury for not only their continued investment into cricket in Canterbury but the support and leadership Julyan Falloon and his team provide to sport in this region. Their willingness to explore, be brave and try new things are characteristics that will continue to evolve the sport sector in Canterbury. New Zealand Cricket are of course the major contributor to cricket in the Canterbury region, with both investment and leadership. The Network and Participation team are supportive and connected in new innovative ways to our people on the ground. Martin Snedden continues to work tirelessly for the community game at a national level with input, evidence and support from all Major and District associations across the country. Gradually cricket is aligning under one system, one strategy and one team that promotes 'A Game for All, A Game for Life'.

Thank you to those District and Sub Association Chairs and board members that have been supportive and continue to engage with us regularly. Your contributions are important and appreciated. Thank you to the Cricket Managers and Game Development staff around the region who worked hard to achieve NZC KPI and local objectives. Lastly acknowledgement and thanks must go to the Canterbury Cricket shared service team, Rachel Candy, Eugene Sanders and Andrew Reid, as well as contractors, volunteers, interns and our part time staff Danielle You, Elle Wykes, Gabby Sullivan, Kristy Havill and Will Kennedy. It has been a challenging year. We are leading and we are learning. We will continue to develop as people and as professionals and ensure the decisions we make and the actions we take are influenced by and focused on the people participating, volunteering, coaching, officiating, administering and watching New Zealand's greatest summer sport.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

1.1 Reporting entity

Canterbury Cricket Association Incorporated ("Canterbury Cricket") is incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

Canterbury Cricket Association Inc. is a public benefit entity for the purposes of financial reporting in accordance with the Financial Reporting Act (2013).

1.2 Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with New Zealand Generally Accepted Accounting Practice ("NZ GAAP"). They comply with Public Benefit Entity Standards Reduced Disclosure Regime ("PBE Standards RDR") and Public Benefit Entity International Public Sector Accounting Standards ("PBE IPSAS") that have been authorised for use by the External Reporting Board for Not-for-Profit entities.

Canterbury Cricket is a public benefit not for profit and is eligible to apply Tier 2 PBE standards on the basis that it does not have public accountability and is not defined as large.

1.3 Measurement basis

Unless otherwise stated, the measurement base is that of historical cost. Reliance is placed on the fact that Canterbury Cricket is a going concern.

1.4 Functional and presentation currency

The financial statements are presented in New Zealand dollars (\$) which is the entity's functional currency, rounded to the nearest

There has been no change in the functional currency.

1.5 Use of judgements and estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the Board and management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

(a) Judgements

Judgements made in applying accounting policies that have had the most significant effects on the amounts recognised in the financial statements is revenue recognition – non-exchange revenue (conditions vs. restrictions).

(b) Assumptions and estimation uncertainties

Assumptions and estimation uncertainties that have a significant risk of resulting in a material adjustment in the year ending 31 July 2018 are the useful life, recoverable amount and depreciation method and rate of Property, plant and equipment.

(c) Changes in accounting estimates

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements and have been applied consistently by Canterbury Cricket.

2. Specific accounting policies

The following specific accounting policies have been used in preparing these financial statements.

2.1 Revenue

Revenue is recognised when the amount of revenue can be measured reliably and it is probable that economic benefits will flow to Canterbury Cricket, and is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

The following specific recognition criteria in relation to Canterbury Cricket's revenue streams must also be met before revenue is recognised.

Revenue from non-exchange transactions

Non-exchange transactions are those where Canterbury Cricket receives an inflow of resources but provides no (or nominal) direct consideration in return.

With the exception of services-in-kind, inflows of resources from non-exchange transactions are only recognised as assets where both:

- It is probable that the associated future economic benefit or service potential will flow to the entity, and
- Fair value is reliably measurable.

Inflow of resources from non-exchange transactions that are recognised as assets are recognised as non-exchange revenue, to the extent that a liability is not recognised in respect to the same inflow.

Liabilities are recognised in relation to inflows of resources from non-exchange transactions when there is a resulting present obligation as a result of the non-exchange transactions, where both:

- It is probable that an outflow of resources embodying future economic benefit or service potential will be required to settle the obligation, and
- The amount of the obligation can be reliably estimated.

The following specific recognition criteria in relation to Canterbury Cricket's non-exchange transaction revenue streams must also be met before revenue is recognised.

Grants from New Zealand Cricket - General Funding and other non-exchange revenue

New Zealand Cricket (NZC) - General Funding and other non-exchange revenue is recognised when the conditions attached to the grant have been complied with. Where there are unfulfilled conditions attached to the grant, the amount relating to the unfulfilled condition is recognised as a liability and released to revenue as the conditions are fulfilled.

Stipulations that are 'conditions' specifically require Canterbury Cricket to return the inflow of resources received if they are not utilised in the way stipulated, resulting in the recognition of a *non-exchange liability* that is subsequently recognised as *non-exchange revenue* as and when the 'conditions' are satisfied.

Stipulations that are 'restrictions' that do not specifically require Canterbury Cricket to return the inflow of resources received if they are not utilised in the way stipulated, do not result in the recognition of a *non-exchange liability*, resulting in the immediate recognition of *non-exchange revenue*.

Revenue from exchange transactions

Grant Revenue from NZ Cricket, Funding Organisation and Other Grants

Grant revenue, with the exception of NZC General Funding as discussed above, is recognised when the conditions attached to the grant have been complied with. Where there are unfulfilled conditions attaching to the grant, the amount relating to the unfulfilled condition is recognised as a liability and released to revenue as the conditions are fulfilled.

Gate Receipts

Entrance fees for functions and events are recorded as revenue when the function or event takes place and are measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Levies

Canterbury Cricket levies participants in various age group teams in respect of a contribution to the cost of attending their respective tournaments. Revenue is recognised over the period of the levy (usually the cricket season). Amounts received in advance for levies relating to future periods are recognised as a liability until such time that period covering the levy occurs.

Sponsorship Revenue

Canterbury Cricket receives cash and non-cash sponsorship in the form of goods and services. The fair value of the cash, goods and services received is recognised as sponsorships revenue in the Statement of Comprehensive Revenue and Expenses when it is probable that the associated future economic benefit or service potential will flow to the entity, and the fair value is reliably measurable.

2.2 Employee benefits

Liabilities for wages and salaries and annual leave are recognised in surplus or deficit during the period in which the employee provided the related services. Liabilities for the associated benefits are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled.

2.3 Financial instruments

Financial assets

Financial assets within the scope of NFP PBE IPSAS 29 Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement are classified as financial assets at fair value through surplus or deficit, loans and receivables, held-to-maturity investments or available-for-sale financial assets. The classifications of the financial assets are determined at initial recognition.

The category determines subsequent measurement and whether any resulting income and expense is recognised in surplus or deficit or in other comprehensive revenue and expenses. Canterbury Cricket's financial assets are classified as loans and receivables. The financial assets include: cash and cash equivalents, receivables from exchange transactions and sundry receivables.

All financial assets are subject to review for impairment at each reporting date. Different criteria to determine impairment are applied for each category of financial assets, of which, Canterbury Cricket has only loans and receivables which is described below.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. After initial recognition, these are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any allowance for impairment. Canterbury Cricket's cash and cash equivalents, receivables from exchange transactions and sundry receivables fall into this category of financial instruments.

Impairment of financial assets

Canterbury Cricket assesses at each reporting date whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired. A financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired and impairment losses are incurred if there is objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the asset (a 'loss event') and that loss event has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset or the group of financial assets that can be reliably estimated.

For financial assets carried at amortised cost, if there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on loans and receivables carried at amortised cost has been incurred, the amount of the loss is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate. The carrying amount of the asset is reduced through the use of an allowance account. The amount of the loss is recognised in the surplus or deficit for the reporting period.

If in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the previously recognised impairment loss is reversed by adjusting the allowance account. If the reversal results in the carrying amount exceeding its amortised cost, the amount of the reversal is recognised in surplus or deficit.

Financial liabilities

Canterbury Cricket's financial liabilities include payables – exchange transactions (excluding GST and PAYE), employee entitlements, loans and borrowings and finance lease liabilities.

All financial liabilities are initially recognised at fair value (plus transaction cost for financial liabilities not at fair value through surplus or deficit) and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.4 Property, plant and equipment

Items of property plant and equipment are initially measured at cost, except those acquired through non-exchange transactions which are instead measured at fair value as their deemed cost at initial recognition.

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured under the Cost Model which shows initial cost including any expenditure directly attributable to the acquisition, delivery or installation (or fair value for items acquired through non-exchange transactions) less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Canterbury Cricket's items are subsequently measured in accordance with the Cost Model.

Any gain or loss on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment (calculated as the difference between the net proceeds from disposal and the carrying amount of the item) is recognised in surplus or deficit.

Depreciation is recognised in surplus or deficit on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of each component of an item of property, plant and equipment. Assets under construction are not subject to depreciation.

The estimated useful lives/straight line depreciation rates are:

Depreciation methods, useful lives, and residual values are reviewed at reporting date and adjusted if appropriate.

2.5 Impairment of non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of Canterbury Cricket's non-financial assets, other than inventories, are reviewed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, then the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

2.6 Leases

Leases in terms of which Canterbury Cricket assumes substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases

Upon initial recognition the leased asset is measured at an amount equal to the lower of its fair value and the present value of the minimum lease payments. Subsequent to initial recognition, the asset is accounted for in accordance with the accounting policy applicable to that asset.

Operating leases

Leases that are not finance leases are classified as operating leases.

Operating leases are not recognised in Canterbury Cricket's statement of financial position. Payments made under operating leases are recognised in surplus or deficit on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives received are recognised as an integral part of the total lease expense, over the term of the lease.

2.7 Income tax

Canterbury Cricket is exempt from Income Tax under section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

2.8 Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST except for receivables and payables, which are stated with the amount of GST included.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the Inland Revenue Department is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities, which is recoverable from, or payable to, the Inland Revenue Department is classified as part of operating cash flows

2.9 Equity

Equity is the community's interest in Canterbury Cricket, measured as the difference between total assets and total liabilities. Equity is made up of the following components:

Accumulated comprehensive revenue and expense

Accumulated comprehensive revenue and expense is Canterbury Cricket's accumulated surplus or deficit since its formation, adjusted for transfers to/from specific reserves.

2.10 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are short term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

2.11 Inventories

Inventories held for consumption in the provision of services that are not sold on a commercial basis are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

For inventory that was acquired through non-exchange transactions, the cost of the inventory is its fair value at the date of acquisition. For inventory held for the distribution or consumption in providing goods and services to be distributed at no charge or for nominal charge, these are measured at cost adjusted for any loss of service potential.




